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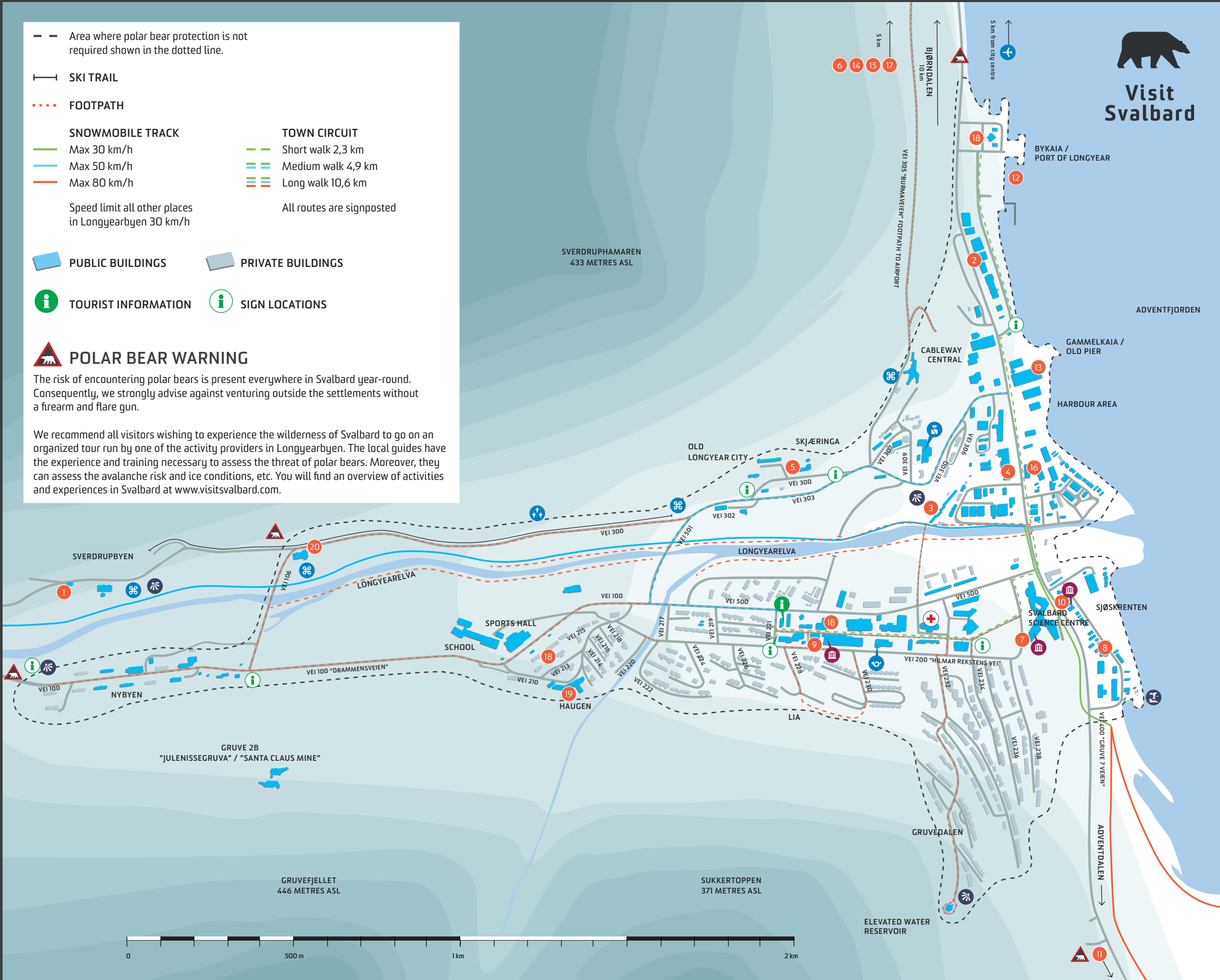
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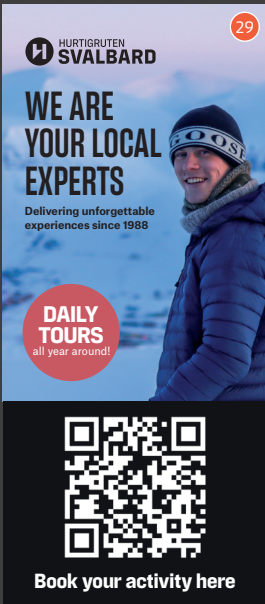
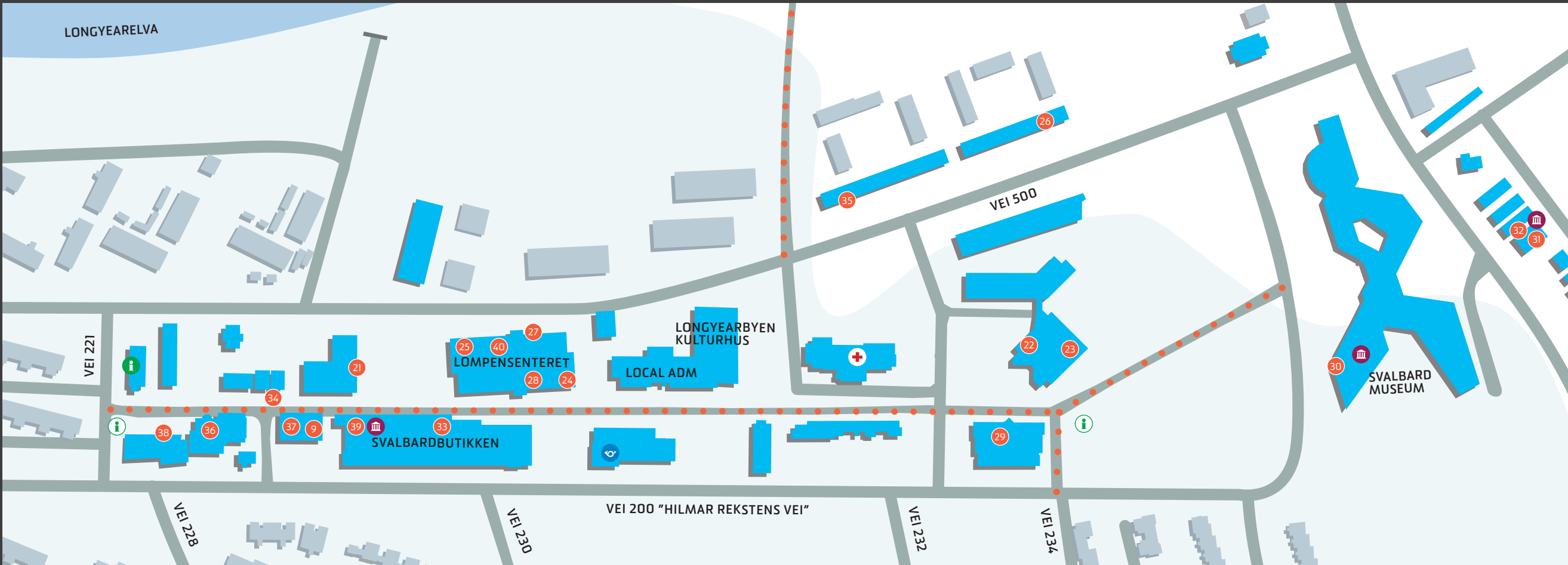
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BOOK YOUR ACTIVITY WITH HURTIGRUTEN SVALBARD

DAILY TOURS all year around!

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SVALBARD MUSEUM is a natural and cultural history museum which imparts knowledge about the way human beings have used nature in Svalbard. The museum shop carries a large assortment of books and literature about Svalbard and the polar region, high-quality souvenirs and clothing and a large selection of maps and postcards.

NORDOVER opened in November 2022 and became the northernmost art center in the world. They host temporary art exhibitions and events by Nordnorsk Kunstmuseum and are also the permanent home of Kåre Tveter Foundation Collection. There is also a cinema, a gallery shop selling works from all across the polar regions and a café.

NORTH POLE EXPEDITION MUSEUM tells the stories about expeditions to the North Pole, mainly with airships but also with skis, dog sleds and boats. The museum is divided across two floors featuring exhibits with old documents, newspapers, pictures, original expedition films, historical artifacts, letters and more. The museum shop sells a range of polar-related items.

SVALBARD BREWERY's story is both one of many firsts and never-ending push for innovation. From changing Norwegian law to using their own waste as an energy resource and always coming up with exciting new projects, they truly encapsulate the "against all odds"-spirit of Svalbard. Learn about their story and how running a brewery in Svalbard works during a brewery visit!

GRUVE 3 – MINE NO. 3 was the last low drifted mine with production from 1971 – 1996. See the workshops, coaltip stations, Blacksmiths' place and the lunch room, and get the chance to test a true miner's life by crawling through a stoll (small tunnel). On our tour we'll walk through Mine no. 3's dark tunnels and experience what it's like inside the mountain.

SVALBARD CHURCH is part of the Church of Norway and organised by the Bishop in Nord-Hålogaland. The Church is a meeting place and a venue for both religious services and cultural gatherings. With the majestic Arctic landscape as our altar cloth, we meet with all kinds of people in all of life's situations. The church is open 24/7.

In our small town of 2 400 people we have an abundance of options for both dining & wining, as well as shopping. The cafés, restaurants and bars are varied, but all offering great food and drinks in a relaxed and welcoming atmosphere. The locals love going out eating and drinking, so why don't you join them?

In between doing activities or visiting attractions you may plan for shopping in one of the town's many shops. Souvenirs, outdoor equipment, gold and much more are to be found – at very reasonable prices as Svalbard is all taxfree (no VAT). **NB!** There is **no ATM** in Longyearbyen, and the shops prefer the use of credit cards.

- Help us keep Svalbard beautiful. Use our rubbish bins and leave no traces behind.
- If you are heading out of town, join an organised tour.
- Notify the Governor's office (Sysselmestern) before setting off on longer field excursions alone.
- Walk on the left side of the road if there is no pavement.
- Cultural monuments and remains from before 1946 are protected by law and must not be moved or damaged.
- Do not disturb animals and birds or get too close to take photos.
- Don't feed, touch or disturb dogs in the dog yards or get too close to take photos.
- Do not pick flowers in Svalbard.
- Polar bears are protected by law. Luring, pursuing or seeking out polar bears is prohibited and extremely dangerous.
- It is compulsory for anyone travelling outside Longyearbyen to be equipped with appropriate means of frightening and chasing off polar bears. Relevant training is also compulsory.
- Get permission before photographing people. Don't photograph children, including at kindergartens or school.
- Carrying loaded firearms in the settlement is prohibited. Taking firearms into shops or public buildings is also prohibited.
